STATEMENT TO

ASSEMBLY, No. 208

with Senate Floor Amendments (Proposed by Senator BEACH)

ADOPTED: MARCH 24, 2022

These Senate amendments:

- (1) change the compensation received by an election worker who fails to attend a training program from \$50 to the State minimum wage;
- (2) change the lowest hourly compensation received by an election worker serving at an April school election from \$5.77 per hour to the State minimum wage;
- (3) change the highest hourly compensation received by an election worker serving at an April school election from to \$21.43 per hour, which is commensurate with the \$300 daily rate for election workers;
- (4) change the hourly compensation received by an election worker serving at an April school election who fails to attend a training program from \$3.85 per hour to the State minimum wage;
- (5) permit a county to provide, at its discretion, additional compensation to election workers in such county in an amount determined by the county, and the additional compensation would be an expense of the county; and
- (6) clarify that the additional compensation provided by counties to election workers for attending a training program applies to all the provisions of R.S.19:45-6.
