ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR **ASSEMBLY, Nos. 1705, 3803, and 4205**

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill Nos. 1705, 3803, and 4205.

As reported by the committee, this Assembly Committee Substitute would expand the establishments in which the Commission on Human Trafficking is required to post public awareness signage.

The commission is currently required to develop a public awareness sign that contains the national, 24-hour toll-free hotline telephone service on human trafficking. Current law requires certain establishments to display the public awareness sign.

This bill expands the establishments which are required to display the public awareness sign to include: gas stations; staffing agencies; State, county, and municipal law enforcement offices; nail salons; and New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission offices.

As reported by the committee, the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill Nos. 1705, 3803, and 4205 is identical to Senate Bill No. 4110, which was also reported by the committee on this date.
