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1 AN ACT concerning traffic calming measures and amending
2 P.L.2004, c.107.

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4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 3 of P.L.2004, c.107 (C.39:4-8.11) is amended to
8 read as follows:

9 3. a. Any speed hump constructed by a municipality or a board
10 of directors or trustees shall conform in design and construction to
11 the technical standards established by the Department of
12 Transportation.

13 A municipality or board shall provide advance warning,
14 including but not limited to, the erection of appropriate signs giving
15 notice of the presence of speed humps before the first speed hump
16 in a series of speed humps and provide for a pavement marker to be
17 placed at the location of the first speed hump. The signing and
18 pavement markings for a speed hump shall conform to the current
19 standards prescribed in the Manual **[of]** on Uniform Traffic Control
20 Devices for Streets and Highways as adopted by the Commissioner
21 of Transportation.

22 b. For all traffic calming measures, the Department of
23 Transportation shall establish a traffic calming tool kit for each type
24 of traffic calming measure utilized in the State for use by
25 municipalities and boards during the planning and implementation
26 process. The tool kit shall include engineering practices, speed
27 limit and daily traffic design guidance, appropriate signing and
28 pavement markings, and any other information or guidance that the
29 commissioner deems appropriate.

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32 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
