- The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) finds that the bill will increase State expenditures by up to \$75,000 in FY 2023 for one-time startup costs related to the establishment of an educational and public information program concerning the State and federal crimes of human trafficking.
- Annual costs thereafter are indeterminate and will depend on whether the department continues or broadens the campaign over multiple fiscal years.

BILL DESCRIPTION

This bill requires the Attorney General to establish an educational and public information program concerning human trafficking offenses under State and federal statutes. The bill appropriates \$75,000 to the Office of the Attorney General for these purposes.

The OLS finds that the bill will increase State expenditures by up to \$75,000 in FY 2023 for one-time startup costs related to the establishment of an educational and public information program concerning the State and federal crimes of human trafficking. The bill does not specify the form the educational and public information program is to take, and so the costs will depend on the implementation decisions made by the Department of Law and Public Safety. Annual costs thereafter are indeterminate and will depend on whether the department continues or broadens the campaign over multiple fiscal years.
