SYNOPSIS

Requires DEP to maintain online recycled-content products marketplace.

CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT

As reported by the Assembly Environment and Solid Waste Committee on November 22, 2004, with amendments.



AN ACT concerning the marketing of recycled products, ¹[amending] 1 P.L.1987, c.365, and amending and]¹ supplementing P.L.1987, 2 3 c.102¹, and amending P.L.1987, c.365¹. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. (New section) The Legislature finds and declares that the public 9 interest would be served if the State established and maintained an 10 online recycled products website as a marketing venue to assist recycled-content product manufacturers and their customers find each 11 12 other; that it would be beneficial for such manufacturers to showcase 13 their recycled-content products in a State sponsored "RecycleStore," in the manner demonstrated by a successful program of the same name 14 conducted by the California Integrated Waste Management Board; that 15 such a website portal could link manufacturers' websites to facilitate 16 17 exchanges between prospective customers and producers of recycled products; that the Department of Environmental Protection, in 18 conjunction with the New Jersey Buy Recycled Business Network, 19 20 should expand the department's existing website to include an online 21 recycled products marketplace to facilitate the marketing of recycled 22 products and recycled paper products in New Jersey. 23 The Legislature therefore determines that the Bureau of Recycling 24 and Planning in the Division of Solid and Hazardous Waste in the 25 Department of Environmental Protection shall establish and maintain an online recycled-content products marketplace within its website to 26 27 facilitate the promotion, marketing and sale of recycled products and 28 recycled paper products in this State. 29 30 2. (New section) a. The Department of Environmental Protection 31 shall establish and maintain an online recycled-content products 32 marketplace within its website portal dedicated to the promotion, 33 marketing and sale of recycled products and recycled paper products. 34 The Bureau of Recycling and Planning in the Division of Solid and 35 Hazardous Waste shall administer the website, in consultation with the New Jersey Buy Recycled Business Network. 36 b. The online recycled-content products marketplace shall be 37 38 known as the New Jersey Recycled Products Marketplace (hereinafter 39 referred to as the "NJ RecycleStore website"). The NJ RecycleStore 40 website shall serve as a marketing venue to assist the manufacturers of recycled-content products and their customers to find $\frac{1}{and}$ locate one 41 42 another.

c. In establishing the NJ RecycleStore website, the department
 shall prepare guidelines, which shall include, but need not be limited
 to, the following:

4 (1) All recycled products or recycled paper products listed on the
5 NJ RecycleStore website may be ordered directly from the
6 manufacturers, including, but not limited to, those manufacturers that
7 accept online ordering via their own business websites ¹[.]:¹

8 (2) Customers may be able to purchase recycled products or 9 recycled paper products directly from the manufacturers listed on the 10 NJ RecycleStore website, whether at wholesale or retail, who may be 11 contacted directly using the contact information provided by the NJ 12 RecycleStore website ¹[.]:¹

(3) Any manufacturer who is a member of the New Jersey Buy
Recycled Business Network may have its products listed on the NJ
RecycleStore website ¹[.]:¹

16 (4) To showcase its recycled-content products on the NJ
17 RecycleStore website, manufacturers may contact the Bureau of
18 Recycling and Planning or the New Jersey Buy Recycled Business
19 Network ¹[.]; and ¹

20 (5) The NJ RecycleStore website shall contain the following21 statement:

"The NJ RecycleStore is sponsored by the Bureau of Recycling and
Planning in the Division of Solid and Hazardous Waste, Department
of Environmental Protection, in consultation with the New Jersey Buy
Recycled Business Network. There are no fees for participating in this
program."

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3. (New section) The department shall, within 30 days of the
effective date of this act, prepare and adopt guidelines for the
operation of the NJ RecycleStore website as provided in section 2 of
P.L., c. (C.)(now before the Legislature as this bill).

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33 4. Section 11 of P.L.1987, c.365 (C.13:1E-96.1.) is amended to
34 read as follows:

11. a. All of the functions, powers and duties heretofore exercised
by the Department of Energy and the commissioner thereof pursuant
to P.L.1981, c.278 (C.13:1E-92 et seq.) are continued and transferred
to and vested in the Department of Environmental Protection and the

b. Whenever in any law, rule, regulation, order, contract,
document, judicial or administrative proceeding or otherwise,

Bureau of Recycling and Planning in the Division of Solid and
<u>Hazardous Waste</u> in the Department of Environmental Protection or

(C.) 5 (now before the Legislature as this bill)(C.13:1E-99.11 through 13:1E-99.32 [and], 13:1E-99.33 and 13:1E-99.34 and C. 6 7 "Agricultural or horticultural land" means land deemed actively 8 devoted to agricultural or horticultural use pursuant to the "Farmland 9 Assessment Act of 1964," P.L.1964, c.48 (C.54:4-23.1 et seq.); 10 "Beverage" means milk, alcoholic beverages, including beer or 11 other malt beverages, liquor, wine, vermouth and sparkling wine, and nonalcoholic beverages, including fruit juice, mineral water and soda 12 13 water and similar nonalcoholic carbonated and noncarbonated drinks 14 intended for human consumption; 15 "Beverage container" means an individual, separate, hermetically sealed, or made airtight with a metal or plastic cap, bottle or can 16 17 composed of glass, metal, plastic or any combination thereof, 18 containing a beverage; 19 "Class A recyclable material" means a source separated 20 nonputrescible recyclable material which is specifically excluded from 21 approval of the department prior to receipt, storage, processing or 22 transfer at a recycling center pursuant to subsection b. of section 41 of P.L.1987, c.102 (C.13:1E-99.34), which material includes source 23 24 separated nonputrescible metal, glass, paper, plastic containers, and 25 corrugated and other cardboard; 26 "Class B recyclable material" means a source separated recyclable 27 material which is subject to approval of the department prior to 28 receipt, storage, processing or transfer at a recycling center pursuant 29 to subsection b. of section 41 of P.L.1987, c.102 (C.13:1E-99.34) and 30 which includes, but need not be limited to, scrap tires, wood waste, 31 tree stumps, and certain construction or demolition debris, including 32 waste asphalt, bricks, cinder blocks and concrete; 33 "Class C recyclable material" means a source separated compostable material which is subject to approval of the department 34 35 prior to receipt, storage, processing or transfer at a recycling center 36 pursuant to subsection b. of section 41 of P.L.1987, c.102 37 (C.13:1E-99.34) and which includes, but need not be limited to, 38 organic materials such as food waste, vegetative food waste and yard 39 trimmings; 40 "Commingled" means a combining of nonputrescible source separated recyclable materials for the purpose of recycling; 41 42 "Compostable" means able to undergo physical, chemical, thermal 43 or biological degradation under aerobic conditions such that the 44 material to be composted enters into and is physically indistinguishable 45 from the finished compost, and which ultimately mineralizes in the environment at a rate similar to known compostable materials such as 46

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1 paper and yard trimmings; 2 "Composting" means the controlled biological degradation of 3 organic matter to make compost; 4 "Contaminant" means solid waste which adheres to, or which is otherwise contained on or in, source separated recyclable materials; 5 6 "County" means any county of this State of whatever class; 7 "Department" means the Department of Environmental Protection; 8 "Designated recyclable materials" means those recyclable materials, 9 including metal, glass, paper, or plastic, polycoated paperboard 10 packaging, including beverage containers and aseptic packaging, food 11 waste, corrugated and other cardboard, newspaper, magazines, or 12 high-grade office paper designated in a district recycling plan to be 13 source separated in a municipality pursuant to section 3 of P.L.1987, 14 c.102 (C.13:1E-99.13); 15 "Disposition" or "disposition of designated recyclable materials" means the transportation, placement, reuse, sale, donation, transfer or 16 temporary storage for a period not exceeding six months of designated 17 18 recyclable materials for all possible uses except for disposal as solid 19 waste; 20 "District" means a solid waste management district as designated by 21 section 10 of P.L.1975, c.326 (C.13:1E-19), except that, as used in the provisions of P.L.1987, c.102 (C.13:1E-99.11 et seq.), "district" shall 22 23 not include the Hackensack Meadowlands District; 24 "District recycling plan" means the plan prepared and adopted by 25 the governing body of a county and approved by the department to 26 implement the State Recycling Plan goals pursuant to section 3 of 27 P.L.1987, c.102 (C.13:1E-99.13); 28 "Food waste" means food processing byproducts, vegetative waste, 29 off-specification food products, food product overruns, and similar 30 food waste materials; "Leaf composting facility" means a solid waste facility which is 31 32 designed and operated solely for the purpose of composting leaves and 33 shall also include leaf mulching operations on land deemed actively devoted to agricultural or horticultural use as defined in section 5 of 34 P.L.1964, c.48 (C.54:4-23.5); 35 "Market" or "markets" means the disposition of designated 36 37 recyclable materials; 38 "Municipality" means any city, borough, town, township or village 39 situated within the boundaries of this State; 40 "Municipal solid waste stream" means all residential, commercial and institutional solid waste generated within the boundaries of any 41 42 municipality; 43 "Paper" means all paper grades, including but not limited to, 44 newspaper, corrugated and other cardboard, high-grade office paper, 45 fine paper, bond paper, offset paper, xerographic paper, mimeo paper, duplicator paper, and related types of cellulosic material containing not 46 more than 10% by weight or volume of non-cellulosic material such as 47

1 laminates, binders, coatings, or saturants;

2 "Paper product" means any paper items or commodities, including

3 but not limited to, paper napkins, towels, construction material, toilet

4 tissue, paper and related types of cellulosic products containing not

more than 10% by weight or volume of non-cellulosic material such as 5

6 laminates, binders, coatings, or saturants;

7 "Plastic container" means any formed or molded and hermetically 8 sealed, or made airtight with a metal or plastic cap, rigid container 9 with a minimum wall thickness of not less than 0.010 inches, and 10 composed primarily of thermoplastic synthetic polymeric material;

"Post-consumer waste material" means any finished product 11 generated by a business or consumer which has served its intended end 12 13 use, and which has been separated from solid waste for the purposes 14 of collection, recycling and disposition and which does not include 15 secondary waste material;

"Recognized academic institution" means any of the following 16 educational or research institutions located in this State: a duly 17 18 authorized institution of higher education licensed by the Board of 19 Higher Education; a public school operated by a local school district; 20 a private vocational school; or a nonpublic school satisfying the State's 21 compulsory attendance requirements;

22 "Recyclable material" means those materials which would otherwise 23 become solid waste, and which may be collected, separated or processed and returned to the economic mainstream in the form of raw 24 25 materials or products;

26 "Recycled paper" means any paper having a total weight consisting 27 of not less than 50% secondary waste paper material and with not less 28 than 10% of its total weight consisting of post-consumer waste 29 material;

"Recycled paper product" means any paper product consisting of 30 not less than 50% secondary waste paper material and with not less 31 32 than 10% of its total weight consisting of post-consumer waste 33 material;

34 "Recycled product" or "product made from recycled material" 35 means any nonpaper item or commodity which is manufactured or 36 produced in whole or in part from post-consumer waste material;

37 "Recycling" means any process by which materials which would 38 otherwise become solid waste are collected, separated or processed 39 and returned to the economic mainstream in the form of raw materials 40 or products;

41 "Recycling center" means any facility designed and operated solely 42 for receiving, storing, processing or transferring source separated 43 recyclable materials; except that "recycling center" shall not include a 44 scrap [processing] metal shredding facility;

45 "Recycling services" means the services provided by persons engaging in the business of recycling, including the collection, 46 47 transportation, processing, storage, purchase, sale or disposition, or

1 any combination thereof, of recyclable materials; 2 "Residue" means any solid waste generated as a result of processing 3 source separated recyclable materials at a recycling center; 4 "Scrap [processing] metal shredding facility" means a commercial 5 industrial facility designed and operated for receiving, storing, processing and transferring scrap automobiles, appliances or other 6 7 source separated, nonputrescible ferrous and nonferrous metal, which 8 materials are purchased by the owner or operator thereof, and which 9 are altered or reduced in volume or physical characteristics onsite by 10 mechanical methods, including but not limited to baling, cutting, 11 torching, crushing, or shredding, for the purposes of resale for 12 remelting, refining, smelting or remanufacturing into raw materials or 13 products; 14 "Secondary waste material" means waste material generated after 15 the completion of a manufacturing process; "Secondary waste paper material" means paper waste generated 16 after the completion of a paper making process, such as envelope 17 18 cuttings, bindery trimmings, printing waste, cutting and other 19 converting waste, butt rolls and mill wrappers; except that secondary 20 waste paper material shall not include fibrous waste generated during 21 the manufacturing process, such as fibers recovered from waste water 22 or trimmings of paper machine rolls, fibrous byproducts of harvesting, extractive or woodcutting processes, or forest residue such as bark, or 23 24 mill broke; 25 "Source separated recyclable materials" means recyclable materials which are separated at the point of generation by the generator thereof 26 from solid waste for the purposes of recycling; 27 "Source separation" or "source separated" means the process by 28 29 which recyclable materials are separated at the point of generation by the generator thereof from solid waste for the purposes of recycling; 30 "Vegetative food waste" means food processing waste from 31 32 materials such as fruits, vegetables and grains, and similar vegetable 33 food waste materials; 34 "Vegetative waste composting facility" means a solid waste facility 35 which is designed and operated for the purpose of composting leaves, either exclusively or in combination with other vegetative wastes 36 37 authorized by the department; 38 "Yard trimmings" means grass clippings, leaves and brush. 39 (cf: P.L.1994, c.122, s.1)]¹ 40
