**SYNOPSIS**

Authorizes the AG or the Commissioner of DOLWD to obtain expedited injunction for violations of law requiring prenotification of certain plant closings, transfers and mass layoffs.

**CURRENT VERSION OF TEXT**

As introduced.



1 AN ACT concerning injunctive relief with respect to prenotification  
2 of certain plant closings, transfers and mass layoffs and  
3 supplementing P.L.2007, c.212 (C.34:21-1 et seq.).  
4

5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State  
6 of New Jersey:  
7

8 1. a. As an alternative to or in addition to any other remedies  
9 at law, the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development or  
10 the Attorney General is hereby authorized to apply for and the court  
11 to grant in an appropriate case, a temporary or permanent injunction  
12 restraining any employer from violating or continuing to violate any  
13 of the provisions of P.L.2007, c.212 (C.34:21-1 et seq.) or any rule  
14 or regulation promulgated thereunder. The court shall issue the  
15 injunction without requirement of a bond.

16 b. Any injunction issued under subsection a. of this section  
17 shall be subject to expedited judicial review.

19 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

22 STATEMENT  
23

24 This bill provides that the Commissioner of Labor and  
25 Workforce Development or the Attorney General may request the  
26 court to grant an injunction against any employer that violates any  
27 provisions of P.L.2007, c.212 (C.34:21-1 et seq.), the “Millville  
28 Dallas Airmotive Plant Job Loss Notification Act.” It further  
29 provides that these injunctions are to be subject to expedited  
30 judicial review.

31 This bill is in response to the sudden closing of the Jevic  
32 Transportation Company, located in Delanco Township, Burlington  
33 County, that resulted in the unexpected loss of approximately 1,000  
34 jobs.
