

SYNOPSIS

The "Safe Playing Fields Act"; restricts use of lawn care pesticides at child care centers and certain schools, playgrounds, and recreational fields.

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AN ACT concerning $\frac{^{3}\text{the}^{3}}{^{3}\text{te}^{3}}$ use of lawn care pesticides at child care 1 centers ³[,] <u>and certain</u>³ schools ³, <u>playgrounds</u>³ and 2 recreational fields, and supplementing Title 13 of the Revised 3 4 Statutes. 5 6 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 7 of New Jersey: 8 9 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Safe 10 Playing Fields Act." 11 12 2. As used in this act: 13 "Charter school" means a school established pursuant to 14 P.L.1995, c.426 (C.18A:36A-1 et seq.). 15 "Child care center" means a child care center licensed pursuant to the provisions of the "Child Care Center Licensing Act," 16 17 P.L.1983, c.492 (C.30:5B-1 et seq.). 18 ³"Community association" means a condominium association, a 19 homeowners' association, a cooperative association, or any other 20 entity created to administer or manage the common elements and 21 facilities of a real property development that, directly or through an 22 authorized agent, enters into a contract for improvement of the real property.³ 23 24 "Lawn care pesticide" means any pesticide labeled, designed or 25 intended for use on lawns, gardens, turf or ornamental plants. ¹"Low impact pesticide" means a low impact pesticide as defined 26 pursuant to section 3 of P.L.2002, c.117 (C.13:1F-21).¹ 27 "Pesticide" means a pesticide as defined pursuant to section 3 of 28 P.L.2002, c.117 (C.13:1F-21) ¹[.] <u>but shall not include a "low</u> 29 impact pesticide."1 30 31 "Playground" means a playground as defined pursuant to section 32 1 of P.L.1999, c.50 (C.52:27D-123.9). 33 "Recreational field" means an athletic playing field ³[, and includes recreational fields within a municipal, county, or State 34 35 park **3**. "School" means any public school or private school as defined in 36 N.J.S.18A:1-1. 37 38 39 3. a. No lawn care pesticide shall be applied on the grounds of 40 any child care center, including a playground or recreational field 41 located at the child care center, ¹[during regular business hours,]¹ except that a lawn care pesticide may be applied as an emergency 42

 appropriate, of the child care center.

b. No child enrolled at a child care center shall be permitted
access to a pesticide treated area for at least seven hours after the
application.

7 No later than one year after the effective date of this act, the c. Commissioner of Environmental Protection, in consultation with the 8 9 Commissioner of Health and Senior Services, shall adopt rules and regulations in accordance with the "Administrative Procedure Act," 10 P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), concerning pesticide 11 12 application, record keeping, and staff and parental notification 13 procedures at child care centers consistent with the goal of 14 mitigating potential health risks to young children by reducing or eliminating the use of pesticides, and by first considering the use of 15 16 low impact pesticides.

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18 4. No lawn care pesticide shall be applied on the grounds of 19 any school, including a playground or recreational field located at 20 the school, ³<u>which enrolls students in kindergarten or in any grade</u> between grade one through eight,³ except that a lawn care pesticide 21 may be applied as an emergency response to eliminate an 22 23 immediate threat to human health. Such emergency shall be 24 determined by the superintendent of the school district, the board of 25 trustees of a charter school, or the principal or chief administrator of a private school, as ²[appropriate] <u>applicable</u>², in consultation 26 with the local health officer 2 , as appropriate 2 . 27

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5. No lawn care pesticide shall be applied on a playground ³[or recreational field]³, except that a lawn care pesticide may be applied as an emergency response to eliminate an immediate threat to human health. Such emergency shall be determined by the municipal or county governing body in consultation with the local health officer, ²<u>as appropriate</u>,² or by the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, as applicable.

³This section shall not apply to any playground on the grounds of
 a community association.³
