1 AN ACT concerning the use of lawn care pesticides at child care 2 centers and certain schools, ¹[playgrounds and recreational 3 fields, \mathbf{J}^1 and supplementing Title 13 of the Revised Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Safe 9 Playing Fields Act." 10 11 2. As used in this act: "Charter school" means a school established pursuant to 12 13 P.L.1995, c.426 (C.18A:36A-1 et seq.). 14 "Child care center" means a child care center licensed pursuant to the provisions of the "Child Care Center Licensing Act," 15 16 P.L.1983, c.492 (C.30:5B-1 et seq.). ¹["Community association" means a condominium association, a 17 homeowners' association, a cooperative association, or any other 18 19 entity created to administer or manage the common elements and 20 facilities of a real property development that, directly or through an 21 authorized agent, enters into a contract for improvement of the real property.]¹ 22 23 "Lawn care pesticide" means any pesticide labeled, designed or 24 intended for use on lawns, gardens, turf or ornamental plants. "Low impact pesticide" means a low impact pesticide as defined 25 26 pursuant to section 3 of P.L.2002, c.117 (C.13:1F-21). 27 "Pesticide" means a pesticide as defined pursuant to section 3 of 28 P.L.2002, c.117 (C.13:1F-21) but shall not include a "low impact 29 pesticide." "Playground" means a playground as defined pursuant to section 30 31 1 of P.L.1999, c.50 (C.52:27D-123.9). 32 "Recreational field" means an athletic playing field. 33 "School" means any public school or private school as defined in 34 N.J.S.18A:1-1. 35 3. a. No lawn care pesticide shall be applied on the grounds of 36 any child care center, including a playground or recreational field 37 38 located at the child care center, except that a lawn care pesticide 39 may be applied as an emergency response to eliminate an 40 immediate threat to human health. Such emergency shall be 41 determined by the chief executive or owner, as appropriate, of the 42 child care center. 43 b. No child enrolled at a child care center shall be permitted 44 access to a pesticide treated area for at least seven hours after the 45 application. EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. Matter underlined thus is new matter.

1 c. No later than one year after the effective date of this act, the 2 Commissioner of Environmental Protection, in consultation with the 3 Commissioner of Health ¹[and Senior Services]¹, shall adopt rules and regulations in accordance with the "Administrative Procedure 4 5 Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (C.52:14B-1 et seq.), concerning pesticide 6 application, record keeping, and staff and parental notification procedures at child care centers consistent with the goal of 7 mitigating potential health risks to young children by reducing or 8 9 eliminating the use of pesticides, and by first considering the use of low impact pesticides. 10

12 4. No lawn care pesticide shall be applied on the grounds of 13 any school, including a playground or recreational field located at 14 the school, which enrolls students in kindergarten or in any grade 15 between grade one through eight, except that a lawn care pesticide 16 may be applied as an emergency response to eliminate an 17 immediate threat to human health. Such emergency shall be 18 determined by the superintendent of the school district, the board of 19 trustees of a charter school, or the principal or chief administrator 20 of a private school, as applicable, in consultation with the local 21 health officer, as appropriate.

¹[5. No lawn care pesticide shall be applied on a playground, except that a lawn care pesticide may be applied as an emergency response to eliminate an immediate threat to human health. Such emergency shall be determined by the municipal or county governing body in consultation with the local health officer, as appropriate, or by the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, as applicable.

This section shall not apply to any playground on the grounds of a community association. **]**¹
