**SYNOPSIS**

Clarifies use of motor vehicle headlights to warn oncoming traffic of certain road conditions is permissible.

1 AN ACT concerning the use of headlights on motor vehicles and  
2 supplementing Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
5 *of New Jersey:*

7 1. No person operating a motor vehicle shall be subject to a  
8 penalty under R.S.39:3-60, or any other section of law, for flashing  
9 the vehicle's headlamps in the direction of oncoming traffic to warn  
10 the operator of another motor vehicle of a traffic accident, a road  
11 hazard, or of the presence of law enforcement officers enforcing the  
12 speed limit.

14 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

19 This bill clarifies that it is permissible for the operator of a motor  
20 vehicle to flash his or her headlights in the direction of oncoming  
21 traffic to warn the operator of another motor vehicle of a traffic  
22 accident, a road hazard, or the presence of law enforcement officers  
23 enforcing the speed limit.
