1 **A JOINT RESOLUTION** recognizing the 100th anniversary of the
2 Armenian Genocide.

3
4 **WHEREAS**, From 1915 to 1923, 1.5 million Armenian people were
5 systematically persecuted and executed by the governments of
6 the Ottoman Empire in the first genocide of the twentieth
7 century; and

8 **WHEREAS**, The genocide began on the night of April 24, 1915,
9 when the Turkish government arrested more than 200 Armenian
10 community leaders in Constantinople and hundreds more soon
11 after; and

12 **WHEREAS**, Most of the prominent public figures of the Armenian
13 community were summarily executed; and

14 **WHEREAS**, The Armenian people were then systematically subject
15 to deportation, expropriation, abduction, torture, massacre and
16 starvation; and

17 **WHEREAS**, Hundreds of thousands of Armenian men, women and
18 children were forcibly removed from their homes and deported to
19 the Syrian desert, where the majority of the deportees died of
20 dehydration and starvation; and

21 **WHEREAS**, It is estimated that by 1918, approximately one million
22 people had perished, while hundreds of thousands had become
23 homeless and stateless refugees; and

24 **WHEREAS**, By 1923, the entire landmass of Asia Minor and historic
25 West Armenia had been expunged of its Armenian population;
26 now, therefore,

28 **BE IT RESOLVED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the*
29 *State of New Jersey:*

31 1. This joint resolution recognizes the 100th anniversary of the
32 Armenian Genocide and acknowledges the criminal mistreatment of
33 the Armenians by the governments of the Ottoman Empire as an
34 issue of international and historic significance.

36 2. The Governor and the Legislature shall call upon the citizens
37 of the State of New Jersey to recognize the 100th anniversary of the
38 Armenian Genocide and honor the memory of the 1.5 million
39 people who died as a result.

41 3. This joint resolution shall take effect immediately.

46 This joint resolution recognizes the 100th anniversary of the
47 Armenian Genocide by the governments of the Ottoman Empire and
