4	BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5	of New Jersey:

7	1. Parental Rights Protected.
8	It is a natural and fundamental right of a parent to direct the
9	upbringing, education, and care of their child. This right shall not
10	be infringed absent clear and convincing evidence that the need
11	therefor is compelling.
12	
13	2. Applicability a. The provisions of P.L. c. (C.)
14	(pending before the Legislature as this bill) shall apply to all laws
15	of this State, whether statutory or otherwise, and whether enacted
16	before or after this act.
17	b. Laws enacted after the date of P.L. c. (C.) (pending
18	before the Legislature as this bill) are subject to the provisions of
19	this act unless such law explicitly excludes such application.
20	
21	3. This act shall take effect immediately.

24	STATEMENT
25	
26	This bill declares the rights of parents to direct the upbringing,
27	education, and care of their child. Under the bill, the rights of
28	parents shall not be infringed by the State absent clear and
29	convincing evidence that the governmental interest as applied to the
30	person is not otherwise served.
