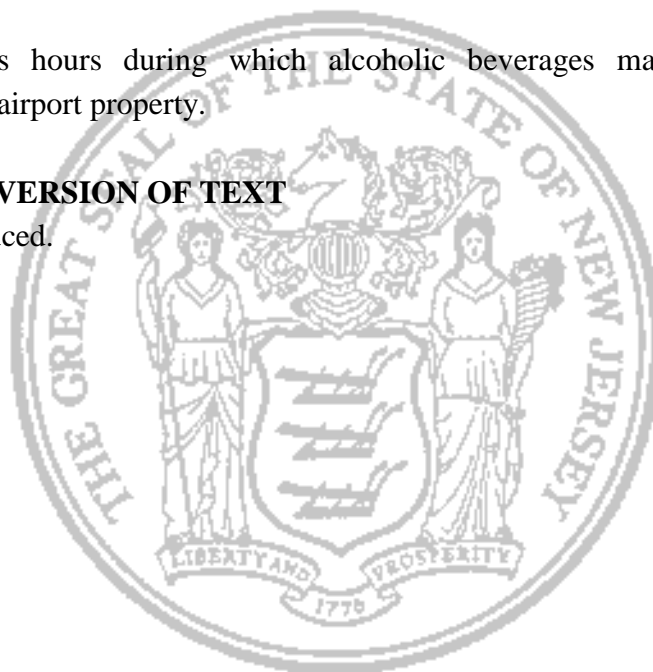

Establishes hours during which alcoholic beverages may be sold on international airport property.

1 AN ACT concerning the sale of alcoholic beverages and amending
2 P.L.1971, c.184.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 1 of P.L.1971, c.184 (C.33:1-40.3) is amended to read
8 as follows:

9 1. a. Whenever the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption
10 on the premises and off the premises or either thereof is authorized
11 in any municipality by ordinance or rule or regulation of the
12 Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, by the holder of a retail
13 consumption or retail distribution license, such ordinance or rule
14 shall authorize the sale of wine and malt alcoholic beverages in
15 original bottle or can containers for consumption off the premises
16 on the same days and during the same hours as the sale of alcoholic
17 beverages for consumption on the premises is permitted and
18 authorized in the municipality. If a municipality has no ordinance
19 or local law that authorizes the sale of alcoholic beverages for
20 consumption on the premises, then the municipality may by
21 ordinance authorize the sale of wine and malt alcoholic beverages
22 in original bottle or can containers by retail distribution licenses
23 any time between the hours of 12:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Sunday,
24 in addition to such weekday hours as may be authorized by
25 ordinance.

26 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section or any other law
27 to the contrary, a city of the first class may establish by ordinance
28 separate hours for:

29 (1) sales by each type of retail license set forth in R.S.33:1-12,
30 and

31 (2) sales by such licensees for consumption on the premises and
32 consumption off the premises.

33 All parts of ordinances and regulations of the Director of the
34 Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control inconsistent with the
35 provisions of this act are superseded to the extent of such
36 inconsistency.

37 b. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,
38 the holder of a plenary retail consumption license or permit
39 authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the
40 premises that is used in connection with a premises located within
41 an international airport may sell alcoholic beverages any time
42 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m.

45 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

3 This bill allows bars and restaurants operating within an
4 international airport to sell alcoholic beverages between the hours
5 of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m.

6 In general, a municipality may establish by ordinance the hours
7 during which alcoholic beverages may be sold for consumption on
8 the premises. This bill establishes extended hours of sale for retail
9 licensees operating an establishment located within an international
10 airport.
