SYNOPSIS

Prohibits person from buying, selling, making or altering, giving, issuing, obtaining or attempting to obtain high school transcripts with intent to deceive and establishes penalty.

1 AN ACT concerning high school transcripts and supplementing
2 chapter 36 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. a. A person shall not buy, sell, make or alter, give, issue,
8 obtain or attempt to obtain a transcript of high school course work
9 with the intent to deceive.

10 b. A person who violates this provision is liable to a civil
11 penalty of \$1,000 for each offense, which shall be collected
12 pursuant to the provisions of the "Penalty Enforcement Law of
13 1999," P.L.1999, c.274 (C.2A:58-10 et seq.).

15 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

20 This bill prohibits a person from buying, selling, making or
21 altering, giving, issuing, obtaining or attempting to obtain a
22 transcript of high school course work with the intent to deceive. A
23 person who violates this provision is subject to a civil penalty of
24 \$1,000 for each offense.
