2 chapter 58 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
5 *of New Jersey:*

7 1. a. The Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the
8 Department of Education, shall develop promotional material for
9 the "School Meal Program" and provide every school district with
10 the "School Meal Program" promotional material, which shall
11 include, but need not be limited to, pamphlets, presentation
12 material, webinars, and sample letters schools may send to parents.

13 b. The "School Meal Program" promotional material shall
14 highlight and promote the value and importance of the National
15 School Lunch Program, the federal School Breakfast Program, and
16 the federal Summer Food Service Program, and the importance of
17 providing a nutritious meal to all children for their general health
18 and their success in school.

20 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

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25 This bill requires the Department of Agriculture, in cooperation
26 with the Department of Education, to develop promotional material
27 for the "School Meal Program" and provide every school district
28 with the "School Meal Program" promotional material, which is
29 required to include, but need not be limited to, pamphlets,
30 presentation material, webinars, and sample letters schools may
31 send to parents.
