4 **WHEREAS**, Multiple system atrophy (MSA) is a rare progressive
5 neurodegenerative disorder characterized by a combination of
6 symptoms that affect both the automatic nervous system and
7 movement; and
8 **WHEREAS**, According to the National Institute of Neurological
9 Disorders and Stroke, MSA may affect between 15,000 and 50,000
10 Americans, including men and women of all races; and
11 **WHEREAS**, Symptoms, including problems with heart rate, progressive
12 loss of motor function and difficulties with balance, coordination,
13 gait, bladder and bowel control, speech, swallowing, and breathing,
14 advance rapidly over the course of five to 10 years once symptoms
15 initially appear; and
16 **WHEREAS**, While there are medications that treat MSA symptoms,
17 researchers continue to search for medications with fewer side
18 effects as well as methods to better manage the disease until a cure
19 is found; and
20 **WHEREAS**, A multidisciplinary approach to MSA care includes
21 physical, psychological, and financial support for patients,
22 caregivers, support groups, and MSA research foundations; and
23 **WHEREAS**, The worldwide MSA community has designated March
24 as “Multiple System Atrophy Awareness Month” to increase
25 awareness of the devastating effects of MSA; now, therefore,

27 **BE IT RESOLVED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the*
28 *State of New Jersey:*

30 1. Each year, March shall be designated as “Multiple System
31 Atrophy Awareness Month.”
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33 2. The Governor may issue a proclamation annually recognizing
34 March as “Multiple System Atrophy Awareness Month” and call
35 upon public officials and the residents of the State of New Jersey to
36 observe the month with appropriate activities and programs.
