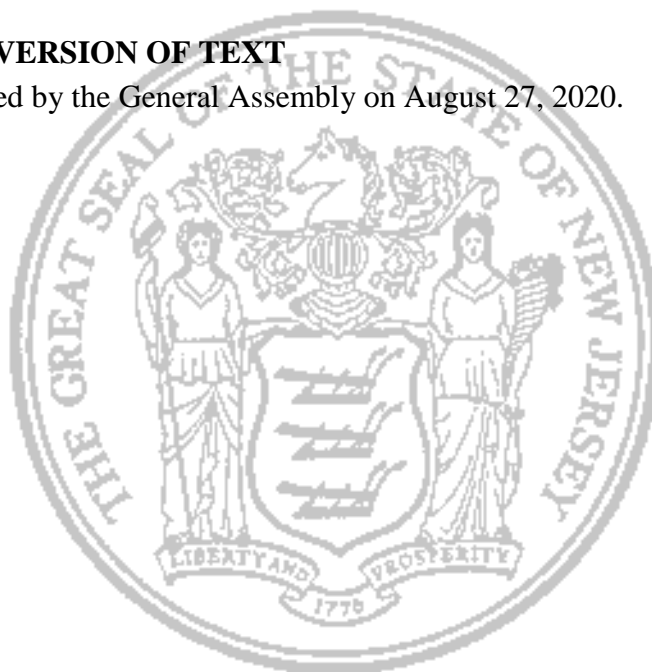

SYNOPSIS

Requires law enforcement officers to wear body cameras.

1 AN ACT concerning law enforcement officers and supplementing
2 chapter 14 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the
8 contrary, every ¹uniformed¹ State, county, and municipal ¹patrol¹
9 law enforcement officer shall wear a ¹body worn¹ camera that
10 electronically records audio and video while acting in the
11 performance of ¹**[his]** the officer's¹ official duties ², except:

12 (1) while engaging in an undercover assignment;

13 (2) when assigned to non-uniformed duties;

14 (3) while serving in an administrative position within the
15 department;

16 (4) while meeting with a confidential informant;

17 (5) while engaging in union representation of a member of the
18 collective bargaining group;

19 (6) when directed by the Chief or a superior officer for a lawful
20 purpose;

21 (7) a detective or investigator of a county prosecutor's office or
22 Division of Criminal Justice when authorized by the County
23 Prosecutor or Attorney General; or

24 (8) at the request of a member of the public pursuant to rules
25 developed by the Attorney General².

26 b. The ¹body worn¹ cameras required by subsection a. of this
27 section shall be funded by forfeiture funds collected pursuant to
28 N.J.S.2C:64-6, in an amount to be determined by the Attorney
29 General.

30 ¹c. For the purposes of this section, "body worn camera" means
31 a mobile video recording system worn by a law enforcement
32 officer.¹

34 2. The Attorney General is authorized to promulgate guidelines
35 or directives, as appropriate, to implement and enforce the
36 provisions of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature
37 as this bill).

39 3. This act shall take effect ¹**[on the first day of the sixth**
40 **month following]** immediately, but shall remain inoperative until
41 the¹ enactment ¹into law of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before
42 the Legislature as Senate Bill No. 101 or Assembly Bill No. 4312 of
43 2020)¹, but the Attorney General may take such administrative
44 action in advance as shall be necessary for the implementation of
45 the act.
