Requires law enforcement officers to wear body cameras.

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AN ACT concerning law enforcement officers and supplementing 1 2 chapter 14 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes. 3 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 4 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. a. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law to the contrary ³and subject to the limit of funds appropriated or otherwise 8 made available for this purpose³, every ¹uniformed¹ State, county, 9 and municipal ¹<u>patrol</u>¹ law enforcement officer shall wear a ¹<u>body</u> 10 worn¹ camera that electronically records audio and video while 11 acting in the performance of 1 [his] the officer's official duties 2 , 12 13 except: (1) while engaging in an undercover assignment; 14 (2) when assigned to non-uniformed duties; 15 (3) while serving in an administrative position within the 16 17 department; (4) while meeting with a confidential informant; 18 19 (5) while engaging in union representation of a member of the 20 collective bargaining group; (6) when directed by the Chief or a superior officer for a lawful 21 22 purpose; 23 (7) a detective or investigator of a county prosecutor's office or 24 Division of Criminal Justice when authorized by the County Prosecutor or Attorney General; or 25 (8) ³[at the request of a member of the public pursuant to rules 26 developed] as may be otherwise provided in accordance with 27 guidelines or directives promulgated³ by the Attorney General². 28 b. ³[The] In addition to funding provided through the annual 29 appropriations act, the³ ¹body worn¹ cameras required by 30 subsection a. of this section ³[shall] \underline{may}^{3} be funded by forfeiture 31 funds collected pursuant to N.J.S.2C:64-6, in an amount to be 32 determined by the Attorney General ³, or any other source of 33 funding made available for this purpose, including but not limited 34 to federal grants³. 35 ¹c. For the purposes of this section, "body worn camera" means 36 a mobile video recording system worn by a law enforcement 37 officer.1 38 39 2. The Attorney General is authorized to promulgate $\frac{3}{\text{ or revise}}^{3}$ 40 guidelines or directives, as appropriate, to implement and enforce 41 42 the provisions of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending before the 43 Legislature as this bill).
