12	of the Superior Court or Tax Court, or judge of the Superior Court or
13	Tax Court who has resigned in good standing, surrogate of any
14	county, county clerk and any mayor or the deputy mayor when
15	authorized by the mayor, or chairman of any township committee or
16	village president of this State, and every minister of every religion, are
17	hereby authorized to solemnize marriage between such persons as may
18	lawfully enter into the matrimonial relation; and every religious
19	society, institution or organization in this State may join together in
20	marriage such persons according to the rules and customs of the
21	society, institution or organization.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.
